Ranger and Community Safety Services

The City of Canning Ranger and Community Safety Service aims to provide peace of mind to residents. Officers are on duty 24 hours a day, seven days a week to discourage anti-social behaviour and provide assistance with relevant legislation and local law matters.

You're in safe hands

All Community Safety Service Officers hold security licences administered by the Western Australian Police Force.



Did you know our Officers:

- Respond to over 11,000 requests a year, which equates to well over 200 requests per week
- Patrol 16 suburbs, with a total area of over 65 square kilometres
- Respond to requests from over 90,000 residents



What do Rangers do?

Our Rangers are on duty seven days a week and can assist with:

- **Animal Control** - Ensuring the registration and control of dogs and cats, including assistance with dog attacks, nuisance barking issues and the control of straying livestock
- **Parking** - Enforcing parking local laws to ensure the safety and convenience for all members of the public, particularly around schools
- **Fire Hazards** - Ensuring compliance with the provisions of the City's Annual Fire Hazard Reduction Notice
- **Litter and Illegal Dumping** - Ensuring a clean and safe community through education and enforcement
- **Off Road Vehicles** - Protecting sensitive areas from unauthorised off-road vehicle use

What do Community Safety Officers do?

In an effort to provide peace of mind to residents, our Community Safety Officers are on duty 24 hours a day, seven days a week to:

- Conduct community patrols in clearly marked vehicles
- Observe, monitor and report suspicious behaviour to Police
- Patrol 'hot-spot' areas to deter criminal behaviour
- Provide a holiday watch patrol service for properties while they are away, at no extra cost
- Provide advice and information on community safety and security
- Detect and report graffiti and vandalism
- Enforce relevant legislation and local laws applicable to the control of animals, parking, litter, abandoned vehicles and vehicles
