

CITY OF CANNING INDUSTRY INSPECTION PROGRAM – COMPLIANCE PLAN 2019-2023

To create a Welcoming and Thriving City, our aim is to be a leader, partner and protector for our community and the environment. We have an important role to play at a local level in regulating dust and odour emissions, noise, solid waste and wastewater discharge.

Our risk-based inspection program means we know which industries can carry a higher risk of off-site environmental impacts and we make sure our program matches this risk. We partner with stakeholders, responding to community concerns and community expectations which is vital to achieving good environmental outcomes.

This plan sets out the basic priorities for the City's Light Industry Program and provides transparency for industry and the broader community on where the City will focus its efforts to protect the community and the environment and how it measures its own performance.

Program Objective:	To ensure the commercial and industrial business community is aware of its environmental obligations and the Swan/Canning river system is not adversely impacted by pollution, enabling a safe and healthy environment.
Key Program Indicators:	The extent to which commercial and industrial premises are meeting their environmental obligations.
Key Measures:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The number of industrial/commercial premises inspected, annually against target. 2. Quantity of polluted wastewater identified that is being discharged to the environment. 3. The quantity of polluted wastewater that is prevented from illegal discharge, through changed business practices, redesign of infrastructure, installation of wash-down bays and connection to sewer. 3. Satisfaction of the business community with the Program Outcomes.

Priority Tasks:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Complete inspections of “high priority” premises. (80 annually). 2. Provide “best practice” guidance to industry and land owners on environmental management to improve knowledge and practices. 3. Provide inspection reports to Industry for each audit (80 per annum).
