19/03/2019		"Tonight, on behalf of the Riverton Rossmoyne and Shelley Residents Association I would like to bring to Council's attention deficiencies in the City's regulatory arrangements for use of verges during building construction - and propose some remedies which would incur no additional costs to the City.	
		In Rossmoyne, Riverton and Shelley we are in the midst of what is likely to be a long and unprecedented period of housing demolition and construction due to two main factors:	
		- the large proportion of houses that were built in the 60s and 70s which do not meet modern tastes or needs and are therefore being demolished and replaced with new houses; and	
		- the large proportion of blocks that are big enough for sub-division.	
		With often two large houses being built on the original block, there is limited room left for builders to store materials and rubbish, locate toilets and carry out preparatory works. So, some of these functions often have to extend onto the adjacent verge. The incidence and cost of theft of building materials and criminal damage to houses under construction have probably contributed to what appears to be a greater use of security fences on the street side of construction sites. These also often encroach out onto the verge.

		The longstanding basic principles underlying regulatory arrangements for use of verges during construction are twofold:	
		- to ensure that thoroughfares are kept open for public use; and	
		- that public property is not damaged or destroyed.	
		At a state-wide level these principles are enshrined in the WA Local Government and the Local Government Miscellaneous Provisions Acts, applied through the Local Government Uniform Local Provisions Regulations and locally in the City's Consolidated Local Laws. A description of how this legal and regulatory structure applies in Canning is in the policy adopted by Council in October 2015, Use of Verge During Building Works and Development, which is available as Guidelines under the same title. Together these laws, regulations and policy form a very sound basis for specifying, administering and ensuring compliance with verge permit conditions.	
		However, our Association has found significant weaknesses in their application which are reflected in the number of construction sites we saw and reported to the City last year that did not have verge permits and/or were blatantly non-compliant with the permit conditions.	
		In considering these weaknesses let's firstly look at the City's verge permit application form:	
		- There is no explicit undertaking for the signatory on the form.	
		- It lacks any reference to the substantial state and local, legal and regulatory basis I've referred to.	
		- Only seven of the City's 20 or so verge permit conditions or requirements are included.	
		- There is only a passing reference to penalties for non-compliance.	
		To find the full list of verge permit requirements you have to read the Guidelines. But the Guidelines:	
		- are not referred to on the verge permit application form, and are not consistently co-located on the City's website with the application form so builders could, and no doubt do download and lodge the application form oblivious of most of the permit conditions.	
		They are only made aware of all the conditions that apply to their permit once it is approved by the City.

		We've also identified two weaknesses in the permit requirements. They do not refer to the siting of boundary fencing and yet some of the worst cases of verge obstruction we saw last year were temporary fencing constructed very close to the kerb line.	
		And the conditions need to be strengthened in relation to the containment and disposal of rubbish to stop it blowing down the street, probably one of the biggest causes of complaint to councils about building works in Australia's windiest capital city.	
		But all these significant deficiencies can be rectified quite easily by:	
		Firstly, adapting the very good verge permit application forms of two other councils – Stirling and Gosnells:	
		- by including a summary reference to the state and local legal and regulatory basis in the Preamble - with a cross reference to the Guidelines.	
		- following Stirling and Gosnells by listing all the verge permit conditions on the form.	
		- with a clear undertaking by the applicant: "As the verge permit holder, I agree to abide by the conditions of the permit".	
		- and also include details on penalties for non-compliance.	
		Secondly, to address the two weaknesses in the conditions I referred to, we have provided in a submission which will be sent to all councillors, words covering the site fencing and rubbish disposal issues.	
		Finally, on the City's website we need to have the verge permit application form and the Guidelines together in one, logical place. The application form and Guidelines are currently listed under the Environmental Health category – underneath "Swimming in the Canning River". The form can also be found on its own under another category, Roads and Verges.	
		Where they should logically be located is with all the other permits on the Building Services page of the website. This would:

		- Reflect the City's current process of initially notifying builders about the verge permit when the Building Permit is issued.	
		- Recognise that all builders should be required to apply for verge permits because they will all be using the verge and adjacent roadway in some way during construction.	
		Moving on from the form and the Guidelines, we find a great lack of public transparency as to whether verge permits are in place and what they allow and prohibit.	
		About half of the City's verge permit conditions relate to preventing obstruction of the public thoroughfares and spread of rubbish. Most of the remainder relate to impact of the building works on City infrastructure and street trees.	
		When a verge permit application is made, a City Officer will usually only visit the building site twice before the permit is issued and work commences and after work is completed to check if there has been any damage to City infrastructure and that the verge has been made good. In other words, City Officers are usually oblivious to any breaches of half of the verge permit conditions while construction is underway unless they are alerted by a member of the public.	
		But if residents are to fulfil this important role, they need better support from the City, not least by making relevant information more easily accessible. After all, how many Canning residents even know of the existence, let alone any of the conditions of the verge permit? Probably no more than a fraction of one per cent. And from the cases our Association has brought to City's attention, there are clearly a few builders who are also unaware of the verge permit system or choose not to apply for one.	
		So, apart from better positioning on its website, the City should require verge permits with all the applicable conditions to be displayed in an enlarged, easily readable format at the front of the construction site beside the builder's sign.	
		This will:	
		- clearly show which builders have complied with the requirement to obtain a permit.	
		- Inform residents what is and what is not allowed in the surrounding public area during construction - and therefore if there are grounds for complaint to the City.	
		- Hopefully act as a perpetual reminder to the builder and all their contractors of their responsibilities.

		Any additional costs of enlarging and laminating the permits for display should be borne by the applicants with a small increase in the application fee which is currently \$297.	
		But detecting and reporting on breaches should not be just left to the public.
