


Canning Swim School Progression Guide

How do I know if my child is ready to move up to the next level?

In order for your child to progress to the next level, they must be 'Competent' in all skills and their blue percentage bar must show 100% at the time of enrolment. Please note, some skills do take longer than others to achieve competency in.

Our teachers use the following scale when marking a child's assessment:

- None (child hasn't been shown the skill yet)
- Introduce (the skill has been introduced to the child)
- Improving (the child is attempting the skill and is making good progress)
- Competent (the skill has been achieved completely, and the child can perform the skill on demand)

The date listed underneath the scale shows when the skill was 'Introduced', when the child was deemed 'Competent', etc.

Our main goal is to ensure all students are strong, competent swimmers before they progress; progressing students too early can prove difficult for them later on. Students are continually assessed throughout the term by their teacher and our Senior Teachers.

Children who achieve all their required skills for their level will be able to progress to the next level within the term (children will not have to wait until the end of term to move up). Once your child has passed, they can move to a new timeslot to being learning the next level's skills. If there are no vacancies, we can create split levels and extend your child to ensure they are learning the next level's skills.

Children enrolled into the wrong level via our online portal will be contacted by the Swim School office to amend their enrolment prior to their first lesson or asked by teaching staff to move to the appropriate level according to their swimming ability at their first lesson. This may result in your child not being able to swim on their preferred day at their preferred time and is dependent on class availability.

Please note, our program differs to those of VacSwim and other swimming schools, therefore their criteria to pass a certain level will be different to ours.
