



Transfer Station Pass FAQs:

- **Who can use the Transfer Station Passes?**

All rate paying Canning residents can make use of the Transfer Station Passes issued. Please note you will need to present your pass and your proof of address (photo ID) to redeem the pass. These passes are non-transferable and are valid until July 2024.

- **How will I receive the Transfer Station Passes?**

The Transfer Station Passes will be issued on a separate DL flyer with your rates notice which come out in July 2023.

Open 8am - 4.30pm, seven days a week (excludes Christmas Day, New Year's Day and Good Friday).

Vehicle entry to site closes 4.15pm. Photo ID and proof of address required for redemption. Damaged or illegible vouchers may not be accepted.

RECYCLING PASS
Unlimited use. Drop off recycling items all year round.
Valid until 1 July 2024. Resident use only, not for resale.

HOUSEHOLD MIXED WASTE PASS
Valid until 1 July 2024. Resident use only, not for resale.

How to find us
The regular access point from Ranford Road is closed due to METRONET Ranford Road Station works.
To enter, travel from Wilfred Road and along Livingston Drive and continue until you see the Waste Transfer Station entry sign. This detour takes about 5-10 minutes.

Household mixed waste pass (residential only)
This pass covers two standard entries for a vehicle and trailer with up to 200kg of mixed waste. Fees apply for excess loads.

- **How many Transfer Station Passes will I receive?**

Each rate paying household will receive two mixed waste passes and one unlimited recycling pass within their rates notice.

- **Is there a limit to the on how much I can drop off each time?**

Yes, there is a limit on how much general waste can be dropped off using the mixed waste pass. The limit is 200kg per visit. For limits on the different recyclables please go to www.canning.wa.gov.au/wts.

- **What can I drop off using the recycling pass?**

Acids, alkalis, aerosols, batteries (car and household), computers and associated e-waste, engine coolants and glycols, fire extinguishers, flammables, flares, fluorescent globes and

tubes, gas cylinders, household chemicals, motor oil, paint, pesticides, poisons, polystyrene (white packing blocks only), pool chemicals, printers, printer cartridges, smoke detectors and televisions. Please note there is a limit of 20kg or 20L per material type per vehicle per day and a limit of 100L of paint per day.

An unlimited of clean flattened cardboard, steel/scrap metal, white goods (excluding fridges) are accepted. For more information, please go to www.canning.wa.gov.au/wts.

- **What can I drop off using the household mixed waste pass?**
Bulky household items, furniture, household junk, timber, sporting equipment etc. Please note that the Waste Transfer Station cannot accept liquid waste.
- **What won't be accepted?**
Asbestos, tyres, construction waste and green waste are all accepted at the Waste Transfer Station for a fee, the Transfer Station Passes cannot be redeemed to drop off these kinds of materials.
- **How do I redeem the Transfer Station passes?**
To redeem the Transfer Station Passes you need to come along to the Waste Transfer Station in Canning Vale with your waste and present the Transfer Station Pass and your photo ID (which will be used for proof of address). Please note these passes are non-transferable and are valid until July 2024.
- **Where is the Waste Transfer Station located and how do I get there?**
The Waste Transfer Station is located off Ranford Road in Canning Vale. Currently due to construction works in the area, the access point from Ranford Road is now closed to the public. To access the Waste Transfer Station, enter from Wilfred Road and follow Livingstone Drive. See the map below for more details.
