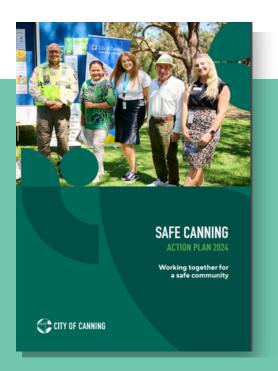

SAFE CANNING STRATEGY

The City's Safe Canning Strategy guides the implementation of initiatives and programs that enhance community safety. This is achieved through the delivery of our annual Action Plan.





PEOPLE

Provide education and awareness that empowers people to actively contribute to a safer community.



PI ACE

Create, design and maintain public places in order to enhance perceptions of safety and reduce opportunistic crime.



PARTNERSHIPS

Foster and maintain partnerships, both formal and informal, to work together to deliver community safety outcomes.

OVERVIEW

The City recognises the importance of consulting with our community and key stakeholders to inform decisions about community safety priorities.

Community awareness and education continues to be a priority action under the Safe Canning Strategy. Delivery of a Community Safety Expo was highlighted as a priority in the 2024 Safe Canning Action Plan.

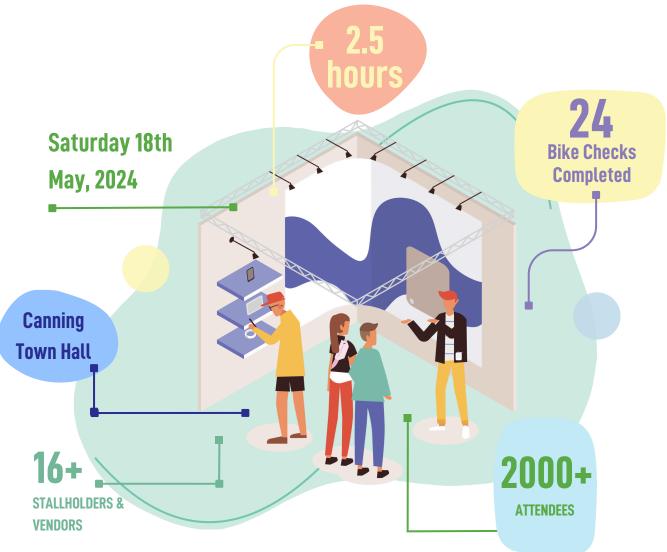
The family-friendly, drop-in style event aimed to facilitate discussions, educate the community on public safety, and showcase some of the great services and programs in the City of Canning.

Inside Town Hall, attendees could approach a variety of stalls to ask their questions and learn more about community safety and emergency preparedness.

There were surveys, prizes, freebies and even free food demonstrations!

Outside, attendees could engage with a number of emergency services, including WA Police, SES, DFES and more.

Visitors could grab food, coffee, take advantage of the free face painting and tour emergency vehicles!

Hard copy flyers at the City's Administration Building, Leisureplex's and large-scale City events

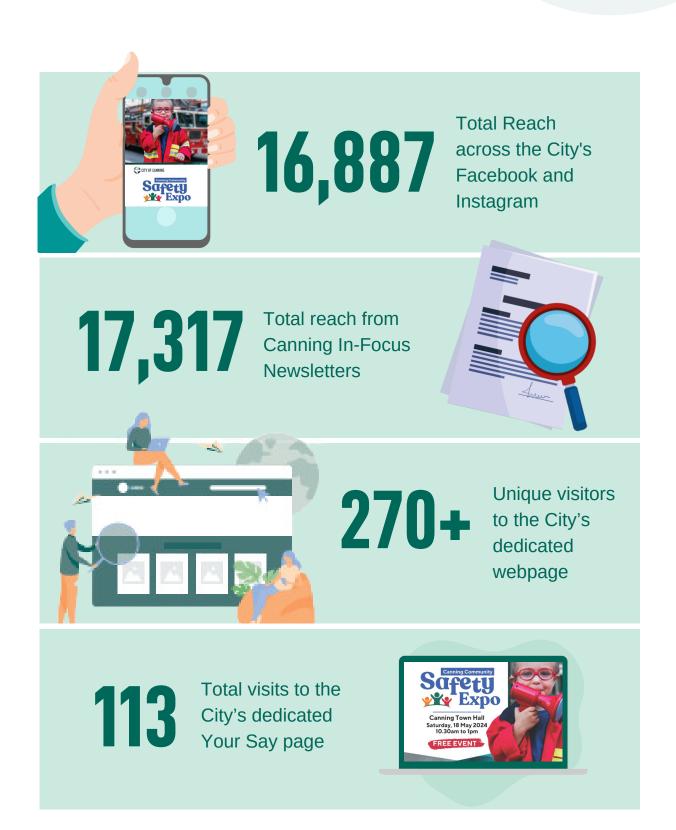

ATTENDANCE

It is estimated that there were over 2000 attendees across the 2.5 hour event.

This was based on:

- an interactive poll
- feedback survey during and postevent
- using capacity trackers
- stallholder/vendor feedback
- the number of resources and merchandise handed out

The 2024 Community Safety Expo saw a level of engagement

45% higher

than the <u>2023 Community Safety</u> <u>Survey</u> (1375 total responses)

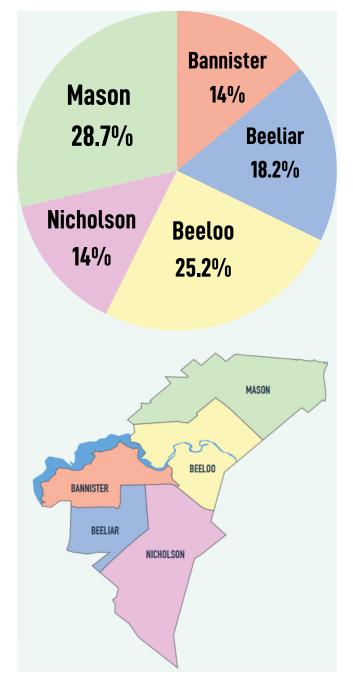
>10 times higher

than the <u>2023 Community Safety</u> Sessions [164 attendees]

To assist in planning and preparation of events, attendees are encouraged to register via a dedicated Eventbrite page. There were 1200 attendees registered to attend the expo. Actual attendance was

67% higher than anticipated.

Attendance at the <u>2023 Community</u> Safety Sessions was <u>42</u>% lower than anticipated.



During an interactive poll, attendees were asked to place a token into the slot that reflected what Canning suburb they lived, worked, or visited most often.

Over 286 families completed the poll, with great representation from all wards. The highest representation came from the suburb of Willetton.

FEEDBACK

The <u>Safe Canning Strategy Cycle</u> recognises the importance of consultation with the community, and the City continues to actively seek engagement opportunities.

To capture feedback, a short survey was created and a Ring video doorbell was offered as an incentive for completion.

The survey was available during the event, was sent to all registered attendees postevent, and promoted on the City's Facebook page.

103 feedback surveys were completed, and all feedback was positive:

- 47 surveys were completed during the event
- 56 surveys were completed post-event

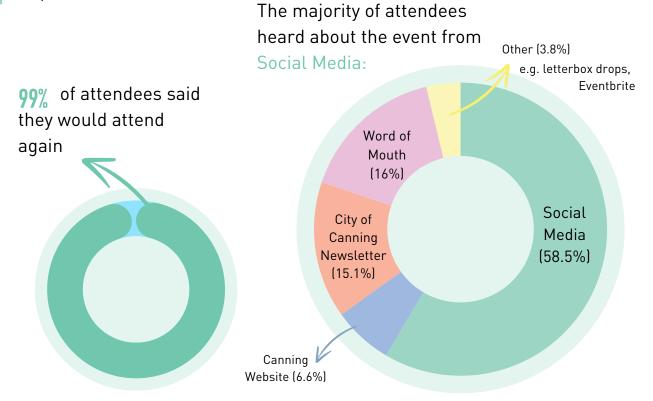

To capture feedback, a short survey was sent to all stallholders, vendors and service providers after the Expo:

100%	said they'd be happy to attend again - 12% said they'd prefer

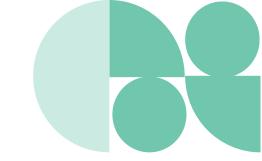

When attendees were asked if Stallholders there was anything missing from the Expo, over 50% of respondents said they'd like to see an ambulance.

> The City had arranged with St John Ambulance to attend the event, but due to unforeseen circumstances they could not attend on the day.

The City will relay this feedback to St John, and will continue to work collaboratively to ensure attendance at future events.

Additional activites

Several feedback comments expressed interest in having additional activities (e.g. bouncy castle) and would like to see representation of the animals used by emergency services (e.g. Mounted and Canine Police divisions).

The City is conscious of utilising free/low cost vendors to maximise funding. It was estimated that the Expo cost approximately \$2 per attendee. The City will aim to source additional low /no cost activities moving forward.

We will also liaise with WA Police to assess the likelihood of having representation from Mounted and Canine divisions at future events.



WHAT CAN YOU DO?

GET TO KNOW YOUR NEIGHBOURS

GET BUSY

The look and feel of an area can impact our perceptions of safety. Report public maintenance issues such as graffiti and faulty lighting. Keep your own property well maintained.
